How the bidding works

Opening 1NT and Balanced hand responses.

Mini Bridge - What you have learnt

- Which Partnership has the most points? They will be declarer.
- How is NT/Suit decided upon?

How the Auction works

- Dealer makes the first call AS IN MINI BRIDGE
- Bidding proceeds in clockwise direction AS IN MINI BRIDGE
- Each bid must 'outrank' the previous bid NEW
- If you don't want to join in PASS NEW
- Bidding starts at 7, i.e. 1 spade means 7 tricks with spades as trumps, 2 spades means 8 tricks with spades as trumps.
- The play and the scoring AS IN MINI BRIDGE

THE AUCTION PROCEEDS UNTIL THERE ARE 3 CONSECUTIVE PASSES

Introducing Bidding Boxes

- Look how limited our language is 4 suits, plus NT, numbers 1 to 7, a pass card and a couple of others we will discuss in a later lesson
- What is a bid? It's a chance to describe your hand to Partner with a view to winning the contract
- Why do we bid? To maximise your chance of a positive score, game bonus etc.

Introducing the Opening bid – 1 No Trump

- 12-14 Points (counting A=4, K=3, Q=2 & J=1)
- A balanced hand
 - No voids
 - No singletons
 - No more than one doubleton

- Shape of a balanced hand
 - 4-3-3-3 (One 4-card suit & three 3-card suits)
 - 4-4-3-2 (Two 4-card suits, one 3-card suit & one 2-card suit)
 - 5-3-3-2 (One 5-card suit, two 3-card suits & one 2-card suit)

Could you open these hands 1NT, and why?

♠ A753

♦ K 4 3

- Open 1NT a balanced hand

- 13 points (It has 4-3-3-3 shape)

• QJ

A 7 2

♦ KQ986

• Q 10 9

- Open 1NT a balanced hand

- 14 points (it has 5-3-3-2 shape)

Neither hand has a singleton, void or more than 1 doubleton.

Could you open these hands 1NT, and why?

• QJ

• A 7

♦ KQ986

Q 10 9 2

- With 2 doubletons this cannot be considered to be a balanced hand (it has a 5-4-2-2 shape)

- **♠** AQ85
- ♥ A75
- **♦** J 9
- **♦** K 10 8 4

- Open 1NT a balanced hand
- 14 points (it has 4-4-3-2 shape)

Could you open these hands 1NT, and why?

♠ AQ85

A 7 6 5

J

♦ K 10 8 4

- With a singleton this hand cannot be called balanced (it has 4-4-4-1 shape)

- **Q** J 5 4
- Q 1062
- **♦** K 4
- **↑** AK9

- a balanced hand
- 15 points, too strong to open 1NT (the shape is ok though, 4-4-3-2)

Could you open these hands 1NT, and why?

- QJ54
- Q 1062
- ♦ A 4
- **★** K96

- Open 1NT a balanced hand
- 12 points (4-4-3-2)

- **♠** A8753
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- ♦ KJ643
- **♠** AJ2

- With a void this hand cannot be called balanced (5-5-3-0)

Responding to 1NT

Classify your hand into Weak, Invitational or Game going hands.

- Weak hands These are those between 0 & 10 pts
 - Here even if partner has a maximum of 14 pts you can only have 24 combined points. So little chance of game therefore Pass.
- Invitational hands These are those between 11 & 12 pts
 - Here if partner has a maximum of 14 pts you will have a minimum of 26 pts, but if partner has only 12 then maybe only 24 pts. So invite Partner to bid game by raising to 2NT.
- Game going hands These are those between 13 & 19 pts
 - Here even if partner has a minimum of 12 pts you have 25 combined points. So a very good chance of game raise to 3NT.

Group Exercise – Hand A

- Your Partner opens 1NT therefore has 12-14 points.
- Game in NT is 3NT (committing to making 9 tricks and getting the 300 point bonus) and needs 25 points or more between Declarer's two hands

•	J 10	What should you bid after partners 1NT?	3NT

•	J 10 6	How many points?	17
•	K Q 7	Weak, Invitational or Game going?	Game
♦	AK98	What are your sides combined points?	29-31
•	K J 10	What should you bid after partners 1NT?	3NT

If the minimum combined points is 25 or more then bid 3NT

Group Exercise continued

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•	J 10 6	How many points?	11
•	K Q 7	Weak, Invitational or Game going?	Invitational
♦	A987	What are your sides combined points?	23-25
•	J 10 9	What should you bid after partners 1NT?	2NT

If the combined total might be 25 pts then raise to 2NT – Invite Partner to bid on.

•	J 10 6	How many points?	10
•	K Q 7	Weak, Invitational or Game going?	Weak
•	A 9 8 7	What are your sides combined points?	22-24
•	10 9 2	What should you bid after partners 1NT?	PASS

If the maximum combined points is less than 25 then Pass

Openers Responsibilities after Partners response to your 1NT

•	AJ 106	How many points?	14
•	K Q 7	Partner Response	2NT
♦	A 9 8 7	What are your sides combined points?	25-26
•	10 9	What should you bid after partners 2NT?	3NT

Partner has Invited you to bid game (3NT) if you have a maximum hand (so 14 pts, not 12 pts). With 13 pts you have to take a view (10's & 9's are useful).

•	Q 10	How many points?	12
•	K Q 7	Partner Response	2NT
♦	A 9 8 7	What are your sides combined points?	23-24
•	J 10 9 2	What should you bid after partners 2NT?	PASS

Even if Partner has a maximum of 12 pts you only have 24 pts between you.
